The BBC develops a prototype for remote control replacement straight out of science fiction-- a headset using the power of the wearer's mind to control an experimental version of the iPlayer on-demand platform.



Based on a cheap brainwave-reading headset, the headset has users turn on and operate the app through either concentrating or relaxing their minds.

"It's an internal prototype designed to give our programme makers, technologists and other users an idea of how this technology might be used in future," the BBC says.
